

Connection vs. Compliance Observational Tip Sheet The A, B, C's and 1, 2, 3's of Connection-based Learning Environments and Interactions

Directions: When observing classroom or other interactions or engagement opportunities, ask yourself whether the following connection-based principles are in place:

A - Attentiveness & Asking

- 1. Attending to students' or others' behaviors and needs from an asset-based lens
- 2. Asking open ended questions to stimulate students' or others' critical thinking and executive functioning skills, as opposed to giving directives or getting into power struggles
- 3. Attending to the answers to open-ended questions, by asking more open-ended questions to demonstrate care and/or concern, and to keep the conversation going

B - Belonging

- 1. Belonging through acceptance
- 2. Belonging through inclusion
- 3. Belonging through identity acknowledgement

C - Connection

- 1. Connection through knowing each student or learner by name
- 2. Connection through empathizing with students' or others' life experiences and circumstances
- 3. Connection through listening deeply, and mirroring what the other person said before responding
